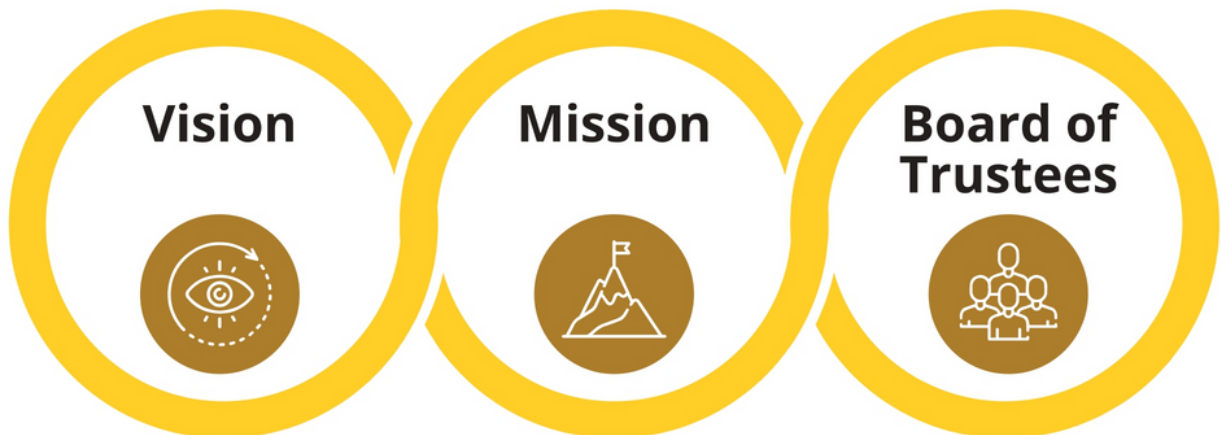

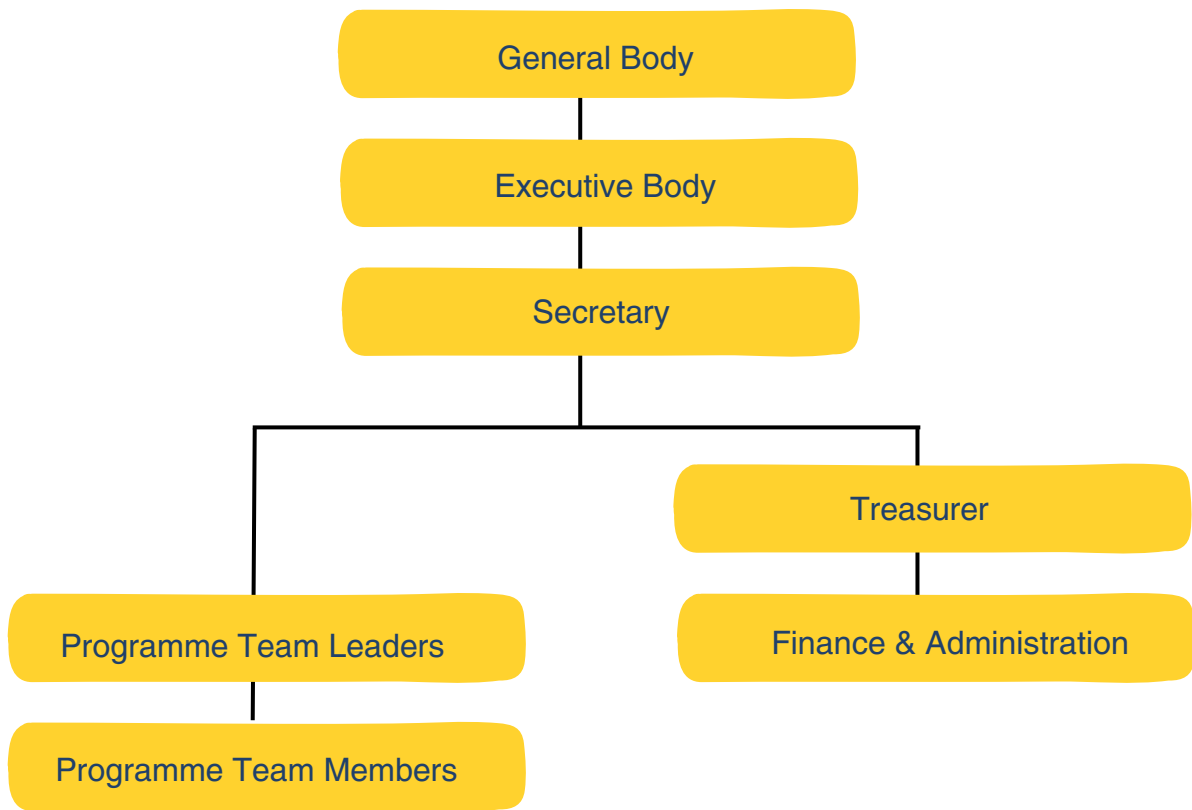

JEETA ORGANOGRAM

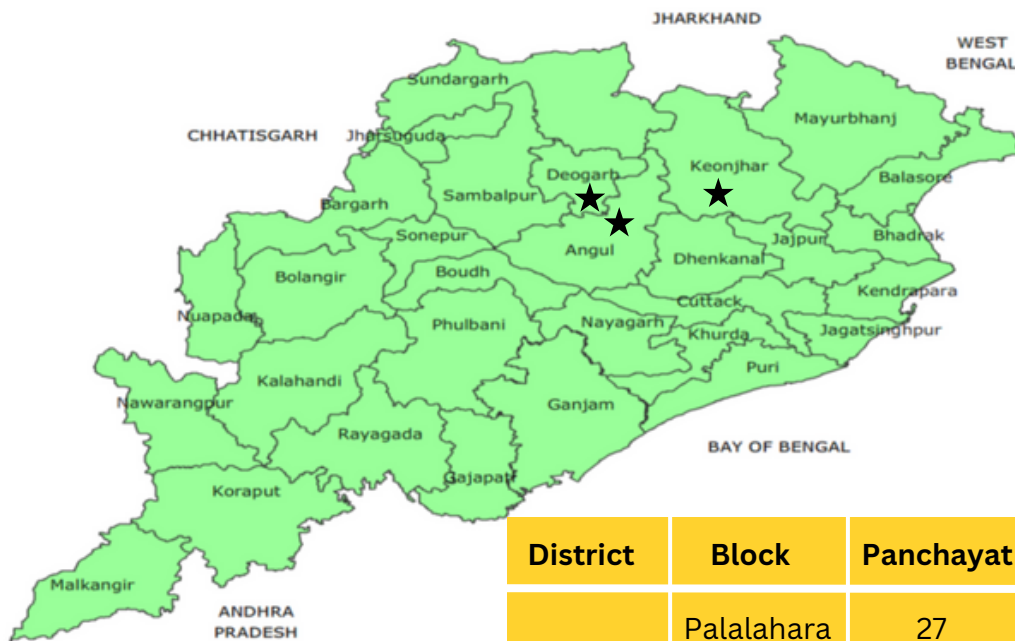


Bye-law of JEETA as empowered General Body as the supreme authority with Governing Body (Board) in down the line, constituted with 5 office bearers headed by the Chairperson. The other office bearers of the Board include the vice chairperson, Secretary, Asst. Secretary, and Treasurer. The Secretary acts as the Chief of the organization, responsible for day-to-day functioning as well as for program Implementation is being helped by program and project staff and the Treasurer for Finance & Administration.

The Bye-law of the organization is there, which elaborates on the role and functional modalities of the general body, Office bearers, and other members for effective governance of the organization. The Board meeting is usually conducted twice a year. to review the progress and decide on a further course of action. The Annual General meeting is conducted once a year for all members to approve operational plan, budget, review the accomplishments, and take major policy decisions.

JEETA is making a significant impact in three districts of Odisha: Deogarh, Anugul, and Keonjhar. With dedicated efforts, JEETA is actively involved with 1087 households in these regions, striving to improve the lives of the underprivileged. The outreach extends to 5284 children, providing them with essential support and access to education and nurturing the potential of the next generation. Moreover, JEETA reached 3500 women, offering them opportunities for skill development and economic independence. The organization also focuses on the youth, engaging with 2800 young individuals to mentor and guide them towards a brighter and more promising future. Through their tireless work, JEETA is making a tangible difference in these communities, fostering growth and uplifting vulnerable populations.

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

In a patriarchal society, even now, it is considered very bad if a woman is not married, separated, divorced, or even widowed. The government's programs for single women are mostly feminist in nature. Most of these women do not have access to or control over property, especially land. Those who have some land in remote tribal pockets and are single are mostly branded as witches and tortured or killed.

To understand the issue of single women at the grassroots level and to find out the suitable strategies for wider applicability, JEETA, in partnership with NAWO Odisha, worked in 12 villages in Saruali and Gurusanga panchayats of Barkote block, Deogarh dist., with the aim of improving the lives of single women so that they could lead a dignified life.



Key Achievements...

1. Building their capacity and changing the patriarchal attitude and understanding that affect them-

200 women oriented on the concept of gender and how its affect their life.

As a result, **35 single women joined in the Palli Sabha & Gram Sabha** & raised their entitlement issues on housing, pension & home stead land. 17 single women's application for Prime Minister Housing scheme was placed in Pallisabha & Gram Sabha.

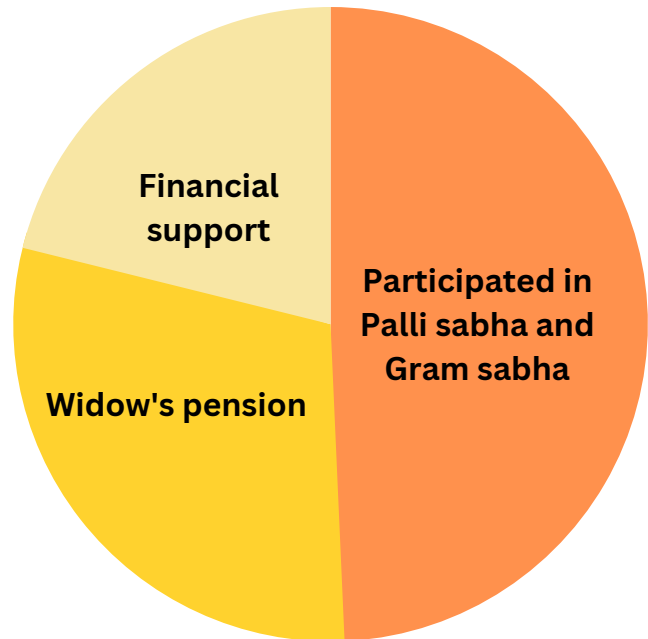
2. Building capacity for self-care by introducing women-centric health care practices-

37 women participated in the training on own body and women's health issues, traditional medicines easily available from natural products



3. Ensuring single women’s access to all government entitlements beyond allowance under Madhu Pension programme and Land rights for single women-

21 widow women have applied for widows' pension with our support from which 9 have received it. 50 women’s land applications are verified by Tehsildar Barkote under the Vasundhara Yojana (Govt. of Odisha scheme for landless people). **15 single women got financial support** from the OPELIP project on the promotion of poultry farm & kitchen gardens.



4. Advocating with the Govt. for more single women-friendly policies and programs, especially to continue what the Govt. of Odisha had initiated on single women’s land rights- State level NGO consultation and meeting were organised in the presence of State Commission of Women. **50+ single women from various districts and NGO representatives** have discussed the kind of problems they are facing and what kind of solution they want.

STORY OF CHANGE

A Resilient Beacon of Hope and Empowerment for Single Women

Chunama Munda, a resilient 33-year-old woman from the quaint village of Nuamunda in the Saruali Gram Panchayat, Barkote Block, Deogarh District, has overcome numerous challenges to emerge as a beacon of hope for single women in her community. With only a 10th-grade education, Chunama found herself working as a laborer, engaging in tractor work, and collecting mahua leaves to make ends meet while living with her mother. However, her determination and desire to uplift others led her down a transformative path.

Today, Chunama's life has taken a remarkable turn, as she now serves as an Anganwadi worker. In her new role, she has become a pillar of support for single women in her village, advocating for their rights and entitlements. With unparalleled dedication, she has helped numerous single women secure widow pensions, guiding them through the process of obtaining vital documents like death certificates, Aadhaar cards, and e-shrama cards. Furthermore, she has played a crucial role in facilitating the allocation of land patta to deserving single women, empowering them with a sense of ownership and stability. Chunama's determination has also empowered single women to voice their concerns in the palli sabha and gram sabha, enabling their issues to be heard and addressed in the broader community.

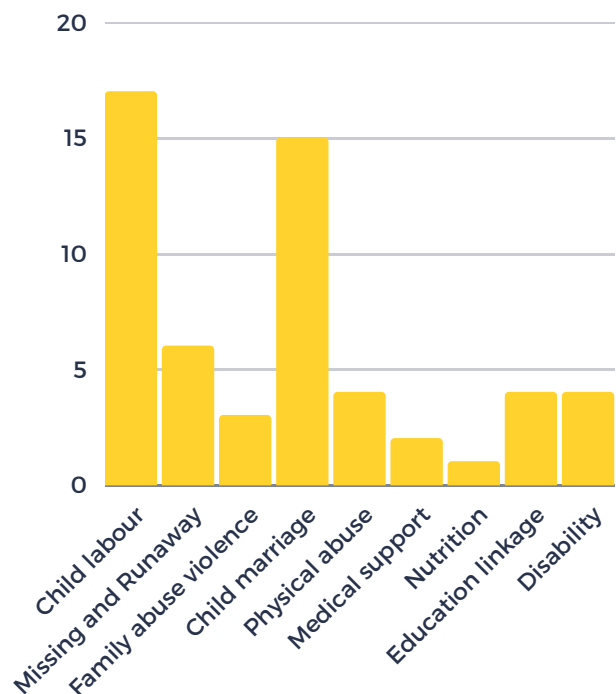

CHILDREN IN NEED AND PROTECTION

Childline 1098 is a service of the Ministry of Women and Child Development. Childline India Foundation is a non-government organization in India that operates a telephone helpline called Childline for children in distress. It was India's first 24-hour, toll-free, phone outreach service for children.

JEETA works as a ChildLine subcenter in Angul District round the clock, arranging for the affected child's immediate needs, ranging from emotional support to medical care, shelter, and protection, before presenting a child before the Child Welfare Committee.

JEETA creates awareness about child rights and its helpline service through open house discussions and awareness programs conducted at various public spots in Anugul. The program synchronizes its work with the Child Welfare Committee, the Odisha State Commission for Protection of Child Rights, the police, and local Non-Governmental organizations (NGOs) working on children's issues. With the help of all stakeholders, children are rescued from risky circumstances.



STORY OF CHANGE

Rescuing Dreams: The Journey of Suru Pingua Towards Safety and Hope

Suru Pingua (name changed), a 16-year-old girl belonging to a tribal community, resides in Pallahara, Anugul. Her family faces financial hardships, and she had to drop out of school.

The story of Suru Pingua sheds light on the issue of child protection she encountered. On January 15, 2023, we received a distressing report of a child marriage case through the 1098 helpline. Without hesitation, our team immediately contacted the caller and rushed to the girl's residence with the support of AWW Madam.

At her house, her parents initially resisted and claimed that she was at her uncle's place. We acted promptly and sent official letters to Child Welfare, the Inspector-in-Charge, Pallahara Police Station, the Child Development Project Officer, and the District Child Protection Officer, Angul, to seek assistance.

Despite our efforts, we couldn't find her that day. However, we returned the next day, gathering more information about her schooling status and date of birth. After two days of investigation, we received a lead on her location. Sub-Inspector madam and Anganwadi madam joined us, and we successfully rescued Suru, taking her to the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) for safety.

The CWC arranged accommodation at Swadhar's home, but Suru's parents later brought her back, expressing their willingness to take care of her until adulthood. We continued to counsel and guide them on providing a safe environment for their daughter. Eventually, after turning 18, Suru moved to her in-laws house. Despite facing challenges, we remained dedicated to ensuring Suru's well-being and protecting her from child marriage.

SUSTAINING AGRICULTURE AND FOOD SECURITY

The "Special Programme for Promotion of Millets in Tribal Areas of Odisha" is a flagship program, popularly known as the Odisha Millets Mission (OMM), launched by the Department of Agriculture and Farmers Empowerment, Govt. of Odisha, in 2017. The broad aim of the program is to revive millets, widely consumed in the tribal belt and other parts of the state traditionally on farms and plates, after observing a changing pattern in agronomic practices and consumption patterns owing to government schemes and programs.

The following are the key interventions made by JEETA under the special project of the Odisha Millet Mission:

Ratha Campaign in villages to promote household consumption of millets and increase awareness for Ragi Procurement among **12000 community members**.

Training with **540 Community Resource Persons (CRPs) and farmers** on the System of Millet Intensification and its benefits.

15 campaigns, workshops, and food festivals for promotion of millets in rural markets.

03 Community seed centers for storing and distributing millet seeds supplied to farmers and demonstration of Crop diversification.

STORY OF CHANGE

From Traditional Farming to Ragi Revolution: Biranchi Pradhan's Inspiring Journey

Biranchi Pradhan's success story with millet production and ragi cultivation in Anasuan, GP-Saharpur, Block-Banspal, Dist-Keonjhar is quite inspiring. The Odisha Millets Mission, facilitated by JEETA, Banspal staff, played a significant role in introducing him to millet production and guiding him through the process. Before the introduction of millet cultivation, Biranchi relied on livestock rearing and horticulture crops like potatoes, vegetables, and oilseeds for his income. However, he was not getting satisfactory results through traditional farming methods. With the guidance and support from JEETA and the utilization of 2 acres of fallow land, Biranchi successfully cultivated ragi using the LT (Line Transplanting) method in 2022. His hard work and dedication paid off, and he managed to harvest 5.5 Qtl (quintals) of ragi. This success caught the attention of ATMA, Keonjhar, which recognized him as a progressive farmer of Banspal block in 2022.

Biranchi's achievement and positive approach towards ragi cultivation have motivated other farmers in the village to consider expanding their own area under ragi cultivation. This success story has the potential to transform the agricultural practices in the region and encourage more farmers to adopt innovative methods like millet production.

Overall, Biranchi Pradhan's journey showcases the importance of agricultural initiatives and support systems like the Odisha Millets Mission and ATMA, which can lead to significant improvements in the livelihoods of farmers and the agricultural sector in the region.

STRENGTHENING CBOS AND GOVT. OFFICIALS ON GENDER & LIFESKILLS

District-level Training of Trainers on Lifeskills Education:

JEETA was invited as resource agency to facilitate training with 140 Child Development Project Officers (CDPO) and Supervisors of Anugul, Deogarh, and Mayurbhanj organized by UNFPA and district administrations.

The main objective of the workshop was to capacitate CDPOs and supervisors to work with adolescents under the Advika program.

Gender Integration Workshop:

JEETA was invited by the Foundation for Ecological Security (FES) to facilitate a 3-day workshop on understanding gender roles and how they impact our everyday access to rights and opportunities with 90 participants, including Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRI) members, staff, and village leaders in Anugul, Keonjhar, and Dhenkanal districts.

Feminist leadership training on Gender Development and Human Rights:

JEETA was invited by The National Alliance of Women (NAWO), Odisha, to facilitate training with 27 staff of 7 Civil Society organizations (CSOs) from 7 districts on gender development and human rights.



The gender training conducted by JEETA for FES staff was excellent and highly recommended for teams at other offices. It provided valuable insights and tools to promote gender equality and inclusivity in the workplace and community.

IMPROVING QUALITY EDUCATION

For the last decade, JEETA's focus has been school and community intervention to ensure quality education for children. We worked with 10 schools in Barkote Block, where we conducted various activities like community awareness on RTE, capacity building of the SMC on RTE, and engaging with teachers on re-enrolment and retention of the children.

We have directly engaged with 1000 children from 25 villages under 5 panchayats through community centers and facilitated different learning activities for improvement in learning. 20 teachers were engaged in the identification of the out-of-school children and the facilitation of the re-enrolment and retention drive. In order to ensure access to school and the participation of the children, activities like sports, art, the wash campaign, and strengthening school cabinets were facilitated with the children.

Educational Progress Report

1. Re-enrollment Success:

- 40 children have successfully re-enrolled in schools.

2. Improved School Infrastructure in 6 schools:

- Separate toilets for girls and boys
- Boundary installation
- Improved water supply

3. Empowered School Cabinets:

- Orientation provided to 10 school cabinets on their roles and responsibilities.

4. Strengthened School Management Committees (SMCs):

- 10 SMCs capacitated on RTE Act.
- SMC members now equipped with knowledge of their roles and responsibilities.



SKILLING YOUTH FOR WATER MANAGEMENT

A series of trainings were organized in a collaborative effort by WaterAid, SkillSonics, and JEETA to meet the plumbing crises in the rural area of Deogarh district, where the people face difficulties getting plumbing services and also hire plumbers at a high rate. Since Jal Jeevan Mission will provide household connections for drinking water, In this mission, work for the operation and maintenance of the pipe water and for additional service of the plumbing will be helpful and most required. The training could support the trainees in getting opportunities in the plumbing work, and local trained plumbers can be engaged in the pipe and water mechanic work.

The following topics are discussed during the one-month training:

- Importance of a Plumber and Scope of Plumbing Work
- Plumbers common hand tools have a name, description, and material from which they are made.
- Description types and use of holding devices, hammers, and cold chisels as cutting tools.
- Description of simple fitting operations hacks, such as punching and filing. Types of files used commonly



97 youth got the one month plumbing training in 3 batches.



STRENGTHENING SYSTEM FOR DIFFERENTLY ABLED PEOPLE

1. Supported people with cleft condition:

JEETA in collaboration with Operation Smile organised an awareness and mobilisation campaign on the treatment facility for cleft in 70 panchayats of Barkote, Telibani and Riamal block of Deogarh district.

100000+ community people **outreached** through poster, leaflet distribution, mike announcement.

17 people with cleft condition were identified for the health checkup camp and oriented on the treatment process.

2. Vaccination drive for different able people

The system is not so inclusive for differently able people which has reflected during covid vaccination. JEETA in collaboration with Santa Memorial Rehabilitation Centre (SMRC) worked for vaccination of differently able people. A list of differently able people in Barkote, Telibani and Riamal block was collected from the district office, ANM and ASHA. We identified the people who had not received covid vaccination. After discussing with Chief District Medical Officer (CDMO), health workers **provided vaccination to 2200+ differently able people** at door step.

3. Supported District administration in facilitating Bhima Bhoi Bhinnakshyama Samarthya Sibir:

JEETA mobilised the people having concern regarding Unique Disability ID (UDID), pension, and other facilities. We coordinated with District Social Security Officer to provide the UDID numbers to the most vulnerable children by door to door visit & discussed with CDMO to support the children by instructing the local doctors. So that the parents will not face the difficulties to bring their child to 70-80 kms to District medical.

Created awareness among 430 persons with disable on their rights & how to create demand it as human rights. **62 persons got UDID number. 11 persons with disabilities got wheel chair.**
