Joint Endeavour for Emancipation Training & Action of women (JEETA), as not for profit organizations, bloomed in the year 1994 when a dedicated group of people hailed from different streams with social work bent of mind came together with the conviction to work for the upliftment of the marginalized section who are at the bottom of the socio-economic ladder in the remote villages of Anugul and Deogarh Districts. From that JEETA has not looked back and marched forward. Since its inception it has been dealing with the issues related to Livelihood, Health, Water Sanitation & Hygiene, Migration, Local Self Governance and Gender Discrimination,

It got registered under Societies Registration Act of 1860 bearing No.19589/21 during the year 1994-95. Subsequently it has been registered under Foreign Contribution Regulation Act bearing the number 104850007 during September 2003. JEETA has also obtained the registration under 12 A & 80 G of the Income Tax Act during 2007 as well as PAN card no. AAAAJ3195Q and TAN BBNJ00598D for fulfilling the tax formalities

JEETA is currently operating with its Head Office at Pallahara of Anugul District and extended project office in Prakrutipalli of Barkote block of Deogarh District. All of its programmatic interventions revolves round the basic approach of partnering with community focusing on their skill building to protect, preserve & manage the local resources and assert their rights to arrest inequality, discrimination and exploitation.

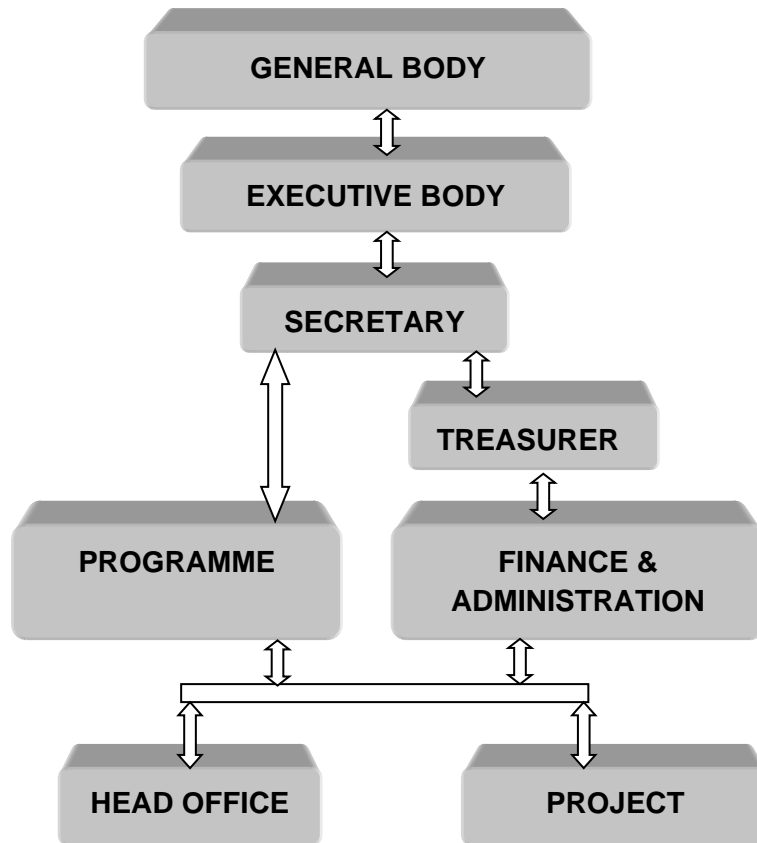

Our governance system

Bye-law of JEETA as empowered General Body as the supreme authority with Governing Body (Board) in down the line, constituted with 5 office bearers headed by the Chairperson. The other office bearers of the Board include Vice Chairperson, Secretary, Asst. Secretary and Treasurer. The Secretary acts as the Chief of the organization, responsible for day-to-day functioning as well as for programme implementation being helped by Programme/project staff and Treasurer for Finance & Administration. The Bye-law of the organization is there which elaborates the role and functional modalities of General Body, Office bearers and other members for effective governance of the organization. The Board meeting is usually conducted

twice a year to review the progress and decide further course of action. The Annual General Meeting is conducted once in every year taking all members to approve operational plan, budget, review the accomplishments and take major policy decisions.

districts are situated adjacently in the central part of the State with rich mineral and forest resources, which are now depleting at an alarming rate due to mining and other industrial activities leaving the lives and livelihoods of the indigenous habitants into the zone jeopardy. OUR PROGRAMMES

Considering the local level issues and problems, JEETA has continued to intensify its effort on the sectors of Livelihood, Water, Health & Sanitation and Women Empowerment along with capacity building of the target communities within the broad framework of our vision and mission.

The major accomplishments during the year 2019-2020 are succinctly articulated below.

I. Conducting different issue based campaigns:

Child Trafficking free India Campaign program organized in Angul District .

The purpose of organizing these activities is to create a momentum for a safe India thought process on the exploitation of children. With these campaign activities, we would aim to change the attitudes and behavioural pattern of people at the grassroots and key stakeholders.

- Activation of District Vigilance Committee under the Bonded Labour Act.
- **Facilitating** district administration to organise Vigilance Committee meeting
- Formation of Village Action Group and placement of Village Migration Register

We have done a survey of the migrant children in five villages of Pallahara block as follows .

- Total Children migrated from Pallahara Malposhi, Nandinipalli, Ishwarnagar & Dimiria Village
- Total –Children migrated- 199
- Construction & brick work -
- F-93
- M-106
- Out of State-105
- Destination point-Chennai, Gujrat & Andhra Pradesh

In the district level meeting with the Member of Parliament of Angul & Dhenkanal Sri Mahesh Sahu, Dist Collector cum Magistrate along with other line departments joined . JEETA has been made a study in Angul dist which was shared in the dist.level meeting. After sharing of the trafficking status all the govt.officials & stake holders agreed to take initiative to make Angul child trafficking free . We are more happy being part of the campaign initiated by Kailash Satyarthi who is our strength to advocate with govt for children during the COVID 19 pandemic situation.



Campaign on Destination Unknown

Mass campaign has been made in four villages of Pallahara Block to sensitization children and their parents on potential risks in job/work sites, child safeguarding & protection measures to be undertaken, Early marriage prohibition Act, Juvenile justice Act etc with the support of CARD Bhubaneswar. There are four villages are taken where most of the children go to outside for searching of work. Regular village level meeting, interface with district & block level officials involvement of local governance is going on. Most of the children who were migrated to Chennai & Hyderabad are in difficult situation due to pandemic. They couldn't return back to village till end of March. A discussion made with the sub collector Pallahara in this regard. The migrant

children communicated to their family & the administration made the arrangement for return of the children



II. Enabling the target communities to access safe improved water, sanitation & hygiene (wash) facilities



Envisioning WASH secured Deogarh District, JEETA has established partnership with Jalseva Charitable Foundation(Water Aid) since 2015-16. With their support and knowledge guidance from District Water & Sanitation Mission Deogarh, it is undertaken a project to enable the communities to access safe improved water, sanitation & hygiene (wash) facilities covering 7943 families with 146073 population in 240 villages of Barkote block focusing on the following aspects:

- Sensitizing the people and constructing toilet with the facility for Persons with disabilities (PwDs)
- Reconstruction and renovation of damaged toilets
- Orientation to School cabinets, Teachers and School Management Committees (SMCs), PRI members and other duty bearers on WASH.
- Participation and putting agenda on WASH deprivation in Palli Sabha/Gram Sabha
- Quarterly follow up with PRI members
- Wall painting of baseline map with multi-vulnerability marking
- Models demonstration (Stream based PWS) in one village of one GP

It is worthwhile to mention that adocacy efforts such as: Liasioning with Gram Panchayats, Block Level Officer, PD DRDA, Collector, Executive Engineer of RWSS are

going on to ensure fund allocation for outreach village to construction & water. Despite of our sincere efforts there are PwDs yet to access toilet & water facilities.

III. Enhancing food & nutritional security:

In Pallahara & Barkote block the farmers of marginalized community continue their practice on rice, wheat, pulses & millets using organic manure. Most of the tribal families of Pallahara & Barkote blocks depend upon the rain water to do any farm work so they do the millet & small variety paddy in the dry land.

After rice they do the vegetable cultivation for their consumption & selling.

With a view to arresting the problems of food insecurity and nutritional deficiencies among the target constituencies a project titled, 'Enhancing food & nutritional security through System of Rice Intensification (SRI) & System of Millet Intensification (SMI)' has been implemented in 27 villages of Barkote & Pallahara Block of Deogarh & Angul District.

Water Security: -

- Interface meeting in between representative of RWS&S, PRI and villagers on fund allocation for MPWS

To address the problem of drinking water in every village and especially in hilly area village, JEETA was organized 7 GP level Interface meetings in the Barkote block area to discuss how to solve the problem by collective efforts of different departments and PRI institution. As a result this year the following activities are executed in different GP area:-

- 38 new tube well and especially 8 new tube well in interior area under barkote block area
- 5 Solar based bore installed well in hilly area habitation.
- Newly water provision in 6 AWW center and 2 schools where water provision was not available as before the meeting.
- Water mapping in 7 GP

5. 50 to 60% budget allocation for drinking water in 7 GP
6. 156 demand applications submitted to district collector and other concern departmental officer including PRI for provision of safe drinking water by SHG and VDC.
7. Gram Sabbha and Palli Sabha proposed for WaSH related activity.

Water Access

- Pilot demonstration of sanitary dug-well based MPWS- Budhabhuin village in one village
- Solar based pipe water supply in 5 village
- House connection with reservoir facilities in 15 villages

The decision was made to turn the hill-forested village into a model village where people had been using spring water for years. Bhudhabhuine is a village under Kaliapal GP of Barkote block where 29 tribal families live. In view of this problem, the decision was made to install water supply to every household with the help of Water Aid and JEETA started work in collaboration with the local GP. By end of February 2020 everyone are access to safe drinking water in their homes.

Empowerment

- **Formation and strengthening of water user committee/ VWSC (with SHG members and developed cadres) at village level**

This year habitation level Water user committees have been set up in 25 villages, The committee consists of SHG mothers, AWW, AHSA, Cadres and PRI members. Each village / habitation has 15 to 20 members, and they will be responsible for providing clean water to every family. The committee has decided to do the following activity.

1. All the formed committee are collecting user fee as per required for O&M of MPWS.
2. 5 committee has been opened bank account in the name of water user committee
3. All committees are able to obtain the required grants from local panchayats

JEETA has been continuing to ensure among people to sustain the organic practice in farm work. As a result less investment in organic fertilizer is going on. The introduction of method of System Intensification in rice, wheat, millet and pulses has resulted in significant yield whereas investment cost is lesser than in case of conventional method. It is very much appreciated by the local farmers, which is

evident from the increasing of farmers and areas covered adopting this method in number year by year. The main strategies espoused to make this programme successful are mentioned below.

- Capacity building and handholding support provided to the farmers in the field.
- Application of organic manures.
- Interface meeting of farmers with the agricultural experts for proper guidance
- Sharing of experiences among themselves

IV. Capacity building of the statkeholders:

Reproductive & Child Health (RCH) is one of the grey area which needs proper attention. Keeping this in mind, with the support of National Rural Health Mission, Deogarh, JEETA has been continuing its effort to capacitate the Accredited Social Health Activists (ASHAs) who play a vital role of service providers in the community level. Details of the capacity building programmes undertaken in this reporting period are explained below.
